BAS-USDA Funded Research Project

Applications are invited for a position of Ph.D. Fellow in BAS-USDA funded research project (6th Phase BAS-USDA SAU CR-06) at Department of Genetics and Plant Breeding, Sher-e-Bangla Agricultural University, Dhaka.

Position: One (1) for 36 months

Fellowship: 40,000/- Tk. per month as per rules of BAS-USDA Endowment Program

Essential Qualifications: M.S. in Plant Breeding & Genetics or Agriculture related sciences. The qualifications of the Ph.D. student will be as per the rules of 'Ph.D. Admission Ordinance' of Sher-e-Bangla Agricultural University, Dhaka.

Duties & Responsibilities: The fellow shall be responsible to develop work plans and implement those to satisfy the project requirements. The fellow will conduct all the field, lab experiments, regional trials of the selected canola-grade breeding lines, analyze the data and prepare the research reports/manuscripts. The fellow shall commit adequate time and effort to the project and follow the advice and instruction of the PI of the project.

Desirable Qualifications: Experience and proficiency in plant hybridization in mustard, field research & regional trials, GxE interaction, selection of promising breeding lines, molecular marker analysis, field research and plant breeding techniques. An additional experience in gas liquid chromatography (GCL) analysis and plant fatty acids analysis would be preferable.
